I am pleased to confirm our staffing arrangements for 2025. Class placements for students will be confirmed at the end of this school year before the summer break.

While we always consider parent requests for class placement, we cannot guarantee that all will be fulfilled. Rest assured that our team carefully considers each child's academic, social, and emotional needs, along with classroom dynamics.

As part of our process, we always allow a 6-week adjustment period for children to settle into their new classes. During this time, we do not make changes to class placements. Any changes would have a domino effect across the school, impacting the placement of all children. We ask for your understanding as we trust that your child will settle in during this period. If after 6 weeks your child is still having difficulties adjusting, you are welcome to contact our Deputy Principal, Ayn Harris, to arrange a face-to-face meeting to discuss your concerns.

Building Projects 2025

We have two building projects underway from the second week of December and into 2025. We have been hoping for these projects to commence for some time.

- Structural weather tight works on the southside of Kiwi & Piwakawaka blocks Term 1 2025.
- Modernisation and structural works on Kea, Ruru, and Te Hokioi classrooms Term 2 2025.

This means that Kiwi and Piwakawaka classes will be based elsewhere for Term 1 2025 as outlined on the next page. They return to these spaces by the end of Term 1 2025.

The Kea, Rūru, and Te Hokioi classroom upgrades will commence once Kiwi & Piwakawaka are complete. This project will achieve greater flexibility, additional work space, and modern classrooms for these remaining three buildings which are the last to receive any modernisation works. Kea & Rūru



classes will move to Piwakawaka in Term 2. Jess Hackett, who will be based in Pukeko teaching Year 1&2, will be able to move to Kea during Term 3.

Tui will operate as a three classroom block while these projects are being done for our middle school children. The Ministry of Education deems this space suitable as a three teacher space because of the building area. In the past, we have chosen to use this space for only 2 teachers to allow for more flexibility. However, given the project work happening, we will be using it as a 3 teacher space, as it was designed to cater for. Tui Jordan will be able to move to Rūru during Term 3.

We have considered multiple configuration options for 2025, working closely with the project manager and Ministry property team. This plan is the least disruptive for all school operations. The following page outlines a summary of decisions now in place for 2025.

By the end of both projects (during Term 3), our spare buildings for music, assemblies, and other activities will either be:

- Te Hokioi & one side of Pukeko OR
- Te Hokioi and the Multipurpose Room

The Library will remain available throughout the year while the building works are happening.

We are looking into how we offer Music in Term 1 through to mid Term 3. There are options, such as the use of the library and northern sides of Piwakawaka and Kiwi.

As I am sure everyone can appreciate, this is a complex operation as we factor in building works for 2025 and your understanding is appreciated. It will be exciting once it is all complete.

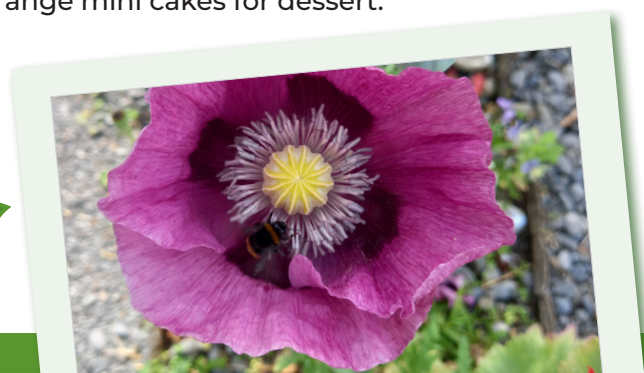
GARDEN TO TABLE

GROW, HARVEST, PREPARE, SHARE

Summer is only a couple of weeks away now, and while the weather has been mainly fine, the temperatures, specially at night can still be a bit chilly. Our summer seedlings are doing well in their straw covered beds but haven't done too much growing yet. They are definitely waiting for higher temperatures. The straw on the garden beds does not only look neat, but it also keeps the weeds down, keeps the moisture in the soil and creates a nice environment for soil microbes and worms to thrive. Mulching your garden beds is always a good idea, the soil should not be left bare, and all sorts of degradable things can be used: Leaves, lawn clippings, old silage...

In week 4 and 5 the garden groups have been busy weeding, watering, fertilizing, sowing seeds and looking after the chickens. While

we have been concentrating on summer vegetables in the garden, the kitchen groups were still cooking with our winter vegetables: Leek, broccoli, cauliflower, snow peas, carrot, parsnip, beetroot and kale. In week 4 Kea, Rūrū and Tūi Williams made a vegetable quiche, salad and lemon curd crumble cake and in week 5 Pīwakawaka and Tūi Dowson cooked a one pot pasta primavera. That dish was quite interesting because all the ingredients go in at once and there are less dishes to clean. There was also a salad on the side and rhubarb and orange mini cakes for dessert.
